



**Dundee Agglomeration: Draft Noise Action Plan  
Response from Environmental Protection Scotland  
December 2013**

Environmental Protection Scotland brings together individuals and organisation across the public, private and voluntary sectors to discuss and promote ideas, knowledge and solutions to achieve our aims of a cleaner, quieter, healthier, sustainable Scotland. We are a registered charity that informs debate, provides impartial advice and policy updates based on sound science and research in the fields of air quality, land quality and noise. Our noise works promotes integrated policies and practices that protects and enhances the quality of Scotland's environment and resources as well as supporting an understanding and the effective management on noise in Scotland.

It is our view that noise action planning is:

- Prioritised by the Scottish Government and at all levels of local authorities with clear input and direction from senior management. This would then allow clear links to be developed within departments for managing sources of environmental noise.
- embedded in regional and national strategic planning
- informed by expert groups

**General Comments**

Environmental Protection Scotland welcomes the Draft Noise Action Plan for the Dundee Agglomeration and we hope that the plan is supported by sufficient resources to implement the proposed actions listed in Section 5.5.

We note that Tayside and Central Scotland Transport Partnership developed a regional transport strategy in 2008 and we hope that this is updated to include provisions within this Draft Noise Action Plan. Similarly we hope that local authority and Scottish Government colleagues working on this action plan work closely with air quality colleagues with the aim of integrating and developing both sets of action plans.

Environmental Protection Scotland would like to congratulate the Aberdeen and Dundee Noise Working Group and SENSG for producing clear, concise strategic noise maps from a multitude of data.

We would like to see both SENSG and the Working Group to proactively communicate this information to the public so that they are aware of what is happening in their region and to ensure that action planning is widely understood by the public.
