

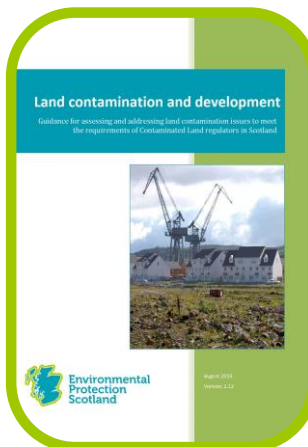


## Housebuilding on Brownfield Land
